From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

This Sunday we celebrate Ascension Sunday. The Feast of the Ascension in the Eastern Church is known as *analepsis*, the taking up, and also as the *episozomene*, the salvation—denoting that by ascending into His glory, Christ completed the work of our redemption. The terms used in the West, *ascensio* and, occasionally, *ascensa*, signify that Christ was raised up by His own powers. Tradition designates Mount Olivet near Bethany as the place where Christ left the earth. The feast falls on a Thursday (9 May this year), the fortieth day after His Resurrection. However, since the liturgical reforms of the mid-20th century Churches have increasingly moved it to the Sunday and termed it Ascension Sunday, as we have done. The purpose being that such a primary feast may be celebrated by the whole parish community. Come and join us this Sunday as we celebrate this important feast in the life of our church.

In the service sheet this week you will notice a slight difference in the way the prayers for the sick have been arranged. We are now going to have a first section of the list for those who are currently seriously ill or recently effected by an accident or sudden illness and are in immediate need of our prayers. The second section contains all those who have been on our prayer list for many months or years who we are still called to pray for as a community of faith. They might be current parishioners, friends or family of parishioners, or those who once belonged to the parish but have now moved away. I recognize that there has been some hurt and confusion about the prayers for the sick over the years and my hope is that this will make it clearer. The purpose of the list is of course not just for them to be mentioned in the context of worship but for all of us in our own prayers to remember and offer intercession. If you have any further questions please don't hesitate to ask.

And finally, as advertised we look with anticipation to Deacon Simon's ordination on Friday 17 May at 7pm. Please if you are able come and support him in this important moment in his ministry as well as the parish of St Michael and All Angels. Deacon Simon's first Mass as Priest will be taking place on Sunday 19 May as we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. We will also have the Order of St Lazarus of Jerusalem joining us for the Feast of Pentecost where they will process and share with us about the ministry of the order during the notices. We look forward to seeing you all at these important events.

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptised with water, but you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judæa and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the Church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Jesus said to the disciples, “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.” Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and he said to them, “Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.” Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ the Word.**

Sermon:

Affirmation of Faith:
