Benediction

As the hymn ends, the wakahuia is lowered. All kneel and remain kneeling throughout. The Sacrament is placed on the altar and the bell is rung.

All praise and thanks to thee ascend for evermore, blest one in three;
O grant us life that shall not end,

The celebrant leads the people in prayer, ending with the Grace.

The Sacrament is returned to the wakahuia and the bell is rung.
