From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

As you would have seen advertised the Christchurch Diocesan Synod is taking place on Thursday 3 September – Saturday 5 September. For those not familiar with the synod, it is the annual gathering of clergy and lay representatives from each parish appointed to vote and contribute to matters of the life of the church. This can include matters such as bills and amendments to the statutes of the church, matters of liturgy and of course the finances of the diocese. We will be gathering this Sunday following the 10am mass morning tea to discuss the upcoming motions and inform the parish about what will be taking place at this year's synod.

In other news we have an announcement about a clergy person who will be joining us for a short placement. In early September we will be welcoming The Reverend Alex Garziglia who is currently the Assistant Curate at St Christopher's, Walworth, London (Diocese of Southwark). Fr Alex will be joining us for around 6 weeks on placement from his parish in the UK. Fr Alex has family who live just outside of Christchurch who he will be staying with, but as he is currently in training as a curate he wished to be involved in a parish while he was in New Zealand. Alex was born and grew up in London. He initially trained as a musician, studying for a degree in music at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Following his studies he worked as a freelance musician working in the UK and abroad, and as a music teacher working with children and adults. Alex enjoys the outdoors, architecture, and reading. When he has time, he plays the clavichord and organ for pleasure. We look forward to welcoming Fr Alex on placement in September.

This Sunday's gospel reading is Matthew 16:13-20. In today's Gospel, we recall a high point in Jesus' relationship with his disciples. It represents a quantum leap in their understanding of who he really is, and it took them quite a while to come to this point. Yet even here, as subsequent events in the rest of the Gospel clearly indicate, they still did not fully understand the implications of what they had just begun to realise. We will see a clear indication of this in next Sunday's Gospel reading. As we gather for Holy Eucharist this Sunday may we, like the disciples, grow in our understanding of who Jesus really is.

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist but others Elijah and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it.
