Dear Parish Family Kia Ora e te whanau

On the Feast of the Annunciation we recall the story from Luke when Mary received an overwhelming visitor and an extraordinary commission. This feisty young woman was call to be 'Theotokos', the God-bearer, the mother of our Lord.

She was called upon to take up the most valuable and precious role she possibly could: she was called to be a mother. Mary was called to hold life in her womb, and to bring life into the world. She was called to staunch crying, to change nappies, to feed, to nurture, and to shelter.

She was called to tend bleeding knees, to teach words, and politeness, and to encourage social interaction.

Mary was called to nurture Faith, to demonstrate Love, to live out Hope, and to teach Understanding.

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## Red Traffic Light—Covid information

Gospel: Luke 1: 26-38 Mother Meg Harvey

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.'

Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God.' Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her. This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ the Word.**

**Affirmation of Faith: (stand)**

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection  $\ ^{\mbox{\colored}}$  of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
