Dear Parish Family

Kia Ora e te whanau

When Jesus enters Jerusalem, the people crowd to see him. They wave palms, they put their cloaks on the ground and they shout to him, *Hosanna, Hosanna, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.*

But how quickly their mood changes. From shouts of joy and welcome soon they are screaming *'Crucify him, Crucify him.'* Betrayed and denied and deserted by his closest friends, he is left alone

At St Michael's we have a series of beautiful liturgies during Holy Week. As your recent Priest-in-Charge, I'm anxious to get them right! If I'm not careful though, if **we're** not careful, we can lose sight of what we are remembering, celebrating and taking part in. As well as celebrating this great week with dignity and reverence, we also need to ask ourselves what it is all about and what it means to each of us.

I think we must ask ourselves 'Where am I in all that's going on in the unfolding drama of this Holy Week? Where am I as Jesus passes by on the donkey? Am I one of the crowd shouting out his name? Or am I bit more like Judas? When have I betrayed others or Jesus? When like Peter, have I denied knowing Jesus? Have I judged and condemned others like the high priests and Pilate? Or am I like Simon or Veronica who helped Jesus in his time of need? Having stood with the crowd shouting out his name and welcoming Jesus, will I stand with the same people spitting out insults as I shout 'Crucify him! Crucify him!'

As we journey through Holy Week, we are called to ask ourselves who and where we are in the crowd. For this is our story too.

Dear friends, may Jesus be our constant companion. May we enter in the mystery of Jesus' life, death and resurrection with faith and hope.

Blessing of Palms, Procession & Solemn Mass The Commemoration of the Lord's Entrance into Jerusalem

Antiphon: Cantors Hosanna to the son of David *The priest addresses the people.*

Priest:

Dear friends in Christ, for five weeks of Lent we have been preparing for the celebration of our Lord's paschal mystery. Now we come together with the whole Church to begin this solemn celebration. Today Christ entered in triumph into his own city, to complete his work as our Messiah: to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us remember with devotion this entry which began his saving work, and follow him with a lively faith.

Palm Gospel:Mark 11: 1–11Mother Meg HarveyWhen Jesus and his disciples were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and
Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them,
"Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find
tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to
you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back
here immediately.' " They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in
the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are
you doing, untying the colt?"

They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

The servant of the Lord said: The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens-wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backwards. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. Pray, sisters and brothers, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the almighty One. May the Lord receive the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his Church.

Priest:

God the Giver of life, your Son has destroyed the power of death for all those who believe in him. Deliver us from all meanness of spirit and make us generous in all we are and do; through Jesus Christ, the Lord of all the living. **Amen.**

The Lord is here. Lift up your hearts. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. God's Spirit is with us. We lift them to the Lord. It is right to offer thanks and praise.

Priest:

Father, all-powerful and ever-living God, we do well always and everywhere to give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ your only Son.

On the night before he died, your Son Jesus Christ took bread; when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them, and said: Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember me.

Priest:

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Glory to you, Lord Christ: your death we show forth; your resurrection we proclaim; your coming we await. Amen! Come, Lord Jesus.

Priest:

Therefore, loving God, recalling your great goodness to us in Christ, his suffering and death, his resurrection and ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation. Accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving which we offer through Christ, our great high priest. Hear the prayers of the family you have gathered here before you. In mercy and love unite all your children, wherever they may be. Welcome into your kingdom our departed brothers and sisters, and all who have left this world in your friendship. We hope to enjoy for ever the vision of your glory through Christ our Lord, from whom all good things come.

United in Christ with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, O God, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing, honour and glory be yours,

here and everywhere, now and for ever. Amen.

Silence

Priest:

As Christ teaches us we pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

Priest:

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

We who are many are one body, for we all share the one bread.

Agnus Dei: (Cantors) Missa Orbis Factor

Priest:

Father if this cup may not pass, but I must drink it, then your will done.

This is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Happy are we who are called to his supper. Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,

but only say the word and I shall be healed.

Communion in one kind will be administered from the front step at the centre of the aisle. Please leave your seat by the side aisle, and approach the centre aisle from the rear crossing. Please leave a 2m distance between yourself and others and please use the hand sanitizer. when receiving the sacrament, please stretch your arms horizontally as much as possible.
