From the Assistant Priest & School Chaplain...

Dear Parish Family

Today is Passion Sunday – the beginning of the so called season of Passiontide. Lent has seemed to fly by and here we are just a couple of weeks away from Easter and that joyous celebration to come.

It is easy to forget how great the journey is from here unto the cross and then resurrection. In the coming days we will experience the thrill of Palm Sunday, the humbleness and institution at the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, the darkness of Good Friday and finally the glorious light of Easter Day.

In the next week I have the task of leading 152 children at the school on this journey before they break for holidays the Friday before Holy Week. As Jesus told us, children are a great lens through which to see Christianity, the Church, faith and scripture. The school chapel services have in the past few weeks begun to talk about the days that make up Easter. For children, of course, repetition is great for learning and sparking their wee minds.

Recently I was with the juniors at chapel when Good Friday was discussed. Mrs Ladley asked what the children thought Mary, the mother of Jesus, might be feeling in the story. I was impressed at the empathy shown. Several children spoke of how Mary must have been sad, even extremely sad. One even ventured to offer that she may have been angry – not an image that usually comes to mind with the scene at the cross.

I had been a little concerned about conveying the range and depth of emotion over Passiontide to these young minds. Not any more. Their minds and hearts are very open to, and aware of, what Easter is and what may have been the experience of Jesus, his disciples and followers.

So, let's follow our young friends in the school and open ourselves up to all the emotions and lessons of the coming Passiontide. Jesus gave himself over to die for our sins, so the least we can do is to give ourselves over to fully experiencing and appreciating the Easter experience.

Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own.

Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on towards the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

Gospel: John 12: 1-8 Fr Peter Beck

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume.

But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."

This is the Gospel of Christ. Praise to Christ the Word.

Affirmation of Faith: (stand)
