

# From the Assistant Priest and School Chaplain....

Dear S. Michael's family,

It is heartening to see so many people joining with us in worship via livestream on Facebook. It is a reminder to us that we live in a globalised world where our little corner of the world is not so far away from the rest of the world as it once was.

Sadly, we see no better example of this than right now with the COVID pandemic. We have learnt that alongside the good things that come from being a global world, there are also risks. We are having to adjust to the new normal seemingly almost every day. Where we are and what is happening is not normal as we knew it.

This uncertainty and constant change in our lives is trying. Humans are not predisposed to change. We are seeing a great increase in levels of anxiety and depression all around the world. Other events, such as the war in the Ukraine, do not help.

I would suggest that our anxiety or depression often is often not recognised by others or even ourselves and certainly we may not be connecting our changing mood to the events and changes around us. Time in prayer helps clarify where, who and what we are in the kingdom of God.

It's hard to be human. Be kind to one another – be kind to yourself. We are not effective servants of the Gospel if we do not take care of ourselves in body, mind and spirit, in the way that we live and move and have our being. More than that, remember to turn to God when you find yourself struggling for He is good and kind. The Transfiguration of Christ we hear this morning reminds us that God has immense powers and the ability to change what we experience at any moment. It shows us the power of God to be heard and to lead the way. It shows us the power of God to take our worries and concerns and transform them into something good and something of God.

# Red Traffic Light—Covid information

- We must adhere to only 100 parishioners at each service plus clergy with 1 mtr distancing.

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem.

Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." Peter did not know what he said.

# **Affirmation of Faith:** (stand)
