From the Vicar...

Dear Friends

It is my first Michaelmas celebration with you all. It is wonderful to see the enthusiasm of the parish for our patronal festival. It is one of those Feasts that has a rich variety of celebrations and traditions.

St Michael is of course the focus of our celebration but there is also the other Angels which are part of the tradition. In the Roman Catholic Church on 29 September three Archangels are celebrated: Saint Michael, Saint Gabriel, and Saint Raphael. Their feasts were unified in one common day during the second half of the 20th century. In the time before their feasts were: 29 September (only St Michael), 24 March for St Gabriel, and, lastly, 24 October for St Raphael.

The Orthodox Churches of the Byzantine tradition honor eight archangels: Michael, Gabriel, Raphael, Uriel, Jeremiel, Salathiel, Jegudiel, and Barachiel. Along with Michael, Gabriel, Raphael and Uriel, the Book of Enoch, regarded as canonical by the Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church, mentions (in chapter 20) Raguel, Saraqael, and Jerahmeel (Remiel).

In the Lutheran, as well as in the Anglican/Episcopalian traditions, there are three to five archangels in the calendar for the 29 September feast for St. Michael and All Angels: namely Michael (Jude 1:9) and Gabriel (Daniel 9:21), and often, Raphael (Tobit 12:15), Uriel (2 Esdras 4:1 and 2 Esdras 5:20) and Jerahmeel (2 Esdras 4:36). St Michael is the patron Saint of both the law profession as well as police officers. Fulfilling that traditional role of guardian. As the Roman Catholic catechism states: "The whole life of the church benefits from the mysterious and powerful help of the angels. From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession." It also states, "Christ is the centre of the angelic world. They are His angels [...] They belong to Him because they were created through and for Him".

Finally, today we have the wonderful occasion of the baptisms of Clement, Robbie and Robert. May they know the protection of the Holy Angels as they are welcomed into God's family and church.

BAPTISM LITURGY

Parents / Godparents of the child say:

I present Clement to be baptised and made a member of the Body of Christ, the Church.

Sponsors say:

We present Robbie/Robert to be baptised and made a member of the Body of Christ, the Church.

From the beginning the Church has received believers by baptism. Believers' children have also been baptised so that with help and encouragement they should grow up in Christ and by the grace of God serve Christ all the days of their life. On the day when the apostles first preached the Gospel of Christ's resurrection, Peter urged his hearers 'Repent and be baptised, every one of you, in the name of Jesus the Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God may call.'

Parents / Godparents of the child say:

In faith I turn to Christ, my way, my truth, my life, as I care for this child.

Each candidate says:

In faith I turn to Christ, my way, my truth, my life.

May God keep you in the way you have chosen.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Praise God who made heaven and earth, whose promise endures for ever.

We thank you God for your love in all creation, especially for your gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.

We thank you for your covenant with your people Israel;

Through the deep waters of death Jesus fulfilled his baptism. He died to set us free and was raised to be exalted Lord of all. It is Christ who baptises with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

Amen. Come Holy Spirit.

We thank you that through the waters of baptism you cleanse us, renew us by your Spirit and raise us to new life.

In the new covenant we are made members of your Church and share in your eternal kingdom.

Through your Holy Spirit, fulfil once more your promises in this water of rebirth, set apart in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom, thanksgiving and honour, power and might, be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!
