## From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

Today is an auspicious day as we gather as a Church and School community to celebrate 175 years of Christian presence here in the heart of Christchurch. Founders Day is a day set aside each year to give thanks for our shared vision, as Church and School, of the importance of not only our Christian faith, but also the traditions and institutions that enable us to live out our mission and ministry as the people of God in our part of the city of Christchurch. There are many dates one could choose to hold such a celebration of 175 years. The first church on the site was built by the Canterbury Association settlers, with Henry Jacobs preaching the opening sermon here in July 1851. The current church building (the third on the site) was officially opened on 2 May 1872. Its cornerstone had been laid on 29 September 1870, the Feast of St Michael & All Angels. The current church building and the site in which we stand is a testament to the vision, faith and tenacity of those who built and nurtured it over the past 175 years. As we gather for this Mass of thanksgiving today, we are aware of all the faithful who surround us, the whole company of heaven, and how we are called to carry on their legacy to the glory of God and the proclamation of the Gospel.

Today is also known as Ascension Sunday. Tradition designates Mount Olivet near Bethany as the place where Christ left the earth. The feast falls on Thursday (14 May this year), the fortieth day after His Resurrection. However, since the liturgical reforms of the mid-20th century Churches have increasingly moved it to the following Sunday and termed it Ascension Sunday, as we have done. The purpose being that such a primary feast may be celebrated by the whole parish community.

The Ascension is part of what we call the Paschal Mystery. There are four interrelated parts: suffering and death; resurrection; ascension; and the sending of the Spirit. They are closely interlocked as one reality. If the Resurrection says that the crucified Jesus is alive, the Ascension says that the living Jesus has entered glory, sharing on an equal level the glory of his Father. This is expressed in many ways in different writings of our Christian (New) Testament. As we gather this Sunday, we do so with a spirit of celebration and joy as we give thanks to God for all he has done for us as a Church, School and a people of faith.

Let us now sing the praises of famous people, our ancestors in their generations. The Lord apportioned to them great glory, his majesty from the beginning.

There were those who ruled in their kingdoms and made a name for themselves by their strength; those who gave counsel because they were intelligent; those who spoke in prophetic oracles; those who led the people by their counsels and by their knowledge of the people's lore; they were wise in their words of instruction; those who composed musical tunes or put verses in writing; rich men endowed with resources, living peacefully in their homes—all these were honoured in their generations and were the pride of their times. Some of them have left behind a name, so that others declare their praise.

But of others there is no memory; they have perished as though they had never existed; they have become as though they had never been born, they and their children after them. But these also were people of compassion whose righteous deeds have not been forgotten; their wealth will remain with their descendants and their inheritance with their children's children. Their descendants stand by the covenants; their children also, for their sake. Their offspring will continue forever, and their glory will never be blotted out. Their bodies are buried in peace, but their name lives on generation after generation. The assembly declares their wisdom, and the congregation proclaims their praise.
