From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of St Peter and St Paul which falls on 29 June. As early as the fourth century a feast was celebrated in memory of St Peter and St Paul on the same day, although the day was not the same in the East as in Rome.

Arguably the most important of all the apostles, Peter, one of the Twelve and the chief of the Apostles, the Rock upon which Christ built His Church, and St. Paul “called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God” (Romans 1:1) and Apostle to the Gentiles. Together they are honoured as founders of the Church of Rome, having been separately martyred there during the reign of Emperor Nero. “Christian tradition has always considered St Peter and St Paul to be inseparable: indeed, together, they represent the whole Gospel of Christ.” (Pope Benedict XVI). Join us this Sunday as we reflect and give thanks for these important saints.

In Parish news we have our shared morning tea this Sunday following the 10am Mass. Parishioners are invited to bring a plate to share which can be left in the hall prior to the service. You would have seen a notice last week about our upcoming Mission Impact Review which is taking place on 20 July. About that time King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword. After he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. (This was during the Festival of Unleavened Bread.) When he had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover. While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him.

The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared, and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, "Get up quickly." And the chains fell off his wrists. The angel said to him, "Fasten your belt and put on your sandals." He did so. Then he said to him, "Wrap your cloak around you and follow me." Peter went out and followed him; he did not realise that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him. Then Peter came to himself and said, "Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting."

Parish Mission Impact Review to take place on 19 and 20 July

The Diocese has reinstated five yearly parish reviews and, following discussions with Fr Jordan, it has been agreed that the Parish of St Michael and All Angels will be reviewed on the **weekend of 19 and 20 JULY**. A Mission Impact Review Team consisting of Rev Mark Chamberlain, Grant Adams (Parish of Avonhead) and Corinne Haines (Parish of Fendalton) will lead the review and interview a selected group of clergy and lay leaders. All members of the congregation will also be invited to complete a questionnaire about the current mission and ministry of the parish.

The purpose of the Mission Impact Review is to **'assess, affirm and challenge'** parishes in their ministry and mission and is a snapshot of parish life. The Team will 'hold up a mirror' to the congregation to enable a process of stock taking and spiritual assessment. This is intended to be a sympathetic and encouraging process designed to strengthen the parish and move the parish toward a more intentional missional footing.

From Sunday 6 July you will have the opportunity to **complete the questionnaire**. The link will be emailed to you and you will have one week to complete it. If you don't have internet access, please complete a paper copy of the questionnaire. Fr Jordan will make this available. Please engage with this process prayerfully and thoughtfully.

Interviews will take place on Saturday 19 July and the reviewers will **attend worship** at St Michael's on Sunday 20 July. This will be followed by morning tea and the reviewers will then make a **presentation to the parish**. A report will then be written and sent to the Parish Vestry with observations and recommendations.

You are also **invited to pray** for the whole review process, the reviewers, Fr Jordan and the other lay leaders. Please direct any questions you have to me by email.
