## A Message from Paul Ellis

As some to the church repair, not for the doctrine, but the music there.

Alexander Pope. 1688 – 1744

The above quotation highlights the important relationship between music and liturgy. Music is a vehicle for the liturgy otherwise we are totally word-bound.

In my first report in 2008 I highlighted the priorities for a Director of Music. My mission, evangelical as it may sound, was to achieve a more confident congregational involvement in the music of the Liturgy and encourage attendance through the quality of the music. Having come straight out of the Cathedral, I was conscious of the importance of congregational participation as opposed to passive involvement. The choir is the backbone of the musical leadership and it has been a delight to see it flourish and be supported by a team of deputies who have covered choir absences. In particular, the Evensong choir has attracted more participants and those in the congregation who want to sunbathe spiritually on a Sunday evening.

The rebuild of the organ in 2013 with a small but very pro-active team of fund-raisers has been a major bonus for the Parish. The introduction of the RSCM Voice for Life scheme for Junior choirs has been of huge encouragement to the perpetuation of our musical heritage and enabled them involvement in parish services.

I have served as Director of Music in many churches, schools and cathedrals over the last 'few years'. In many ways, the maintaining of the musical tradition at St Michael and All Angels for the past 18 or so years (my longest tenure anywhere) has been the most challenging but most fulfilling. There is a time however, when the baton has to be passed to a younger generation who in their own way will make their mark.

Throughout my career I have been blessed by supportive clergy, choirs and parishioners who have shown a genuine appreciation for the importance of the music in Liturgy. May this wonderful legacy be perpetuated.

Warmest thanks to the Parish for being part of a great team.

The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, “Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, ‘After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.’ I myself did not know him, but I came baptising with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.” And John testified, “I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptise with water said to me, ‘He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptises with the Holy Spirit.’ And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Chosen One.”

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by he exclaimed, “Look, here is the Lamb of God!” The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” (which translated means Teacher), “where are you staying?” He said to them, “Come and see.” They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o’clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, “You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas” (which is translated Peter).

This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ the Word.**

### 175th Anniversary of the First Service

Next Tuesday marks the 175th anniversary of the first church service in the parish. On Sunday, 20 January 1851, 150 years ago, the first church and school at Christchurch was inaugurated. The preacher at the first service was not the incumbent, George Theodosius Boughton Kingdon, but William Wellington Willock, who arrived at Lyttelton on 16 December 1850 on the “Randolph”. The organist for the service was John Bilton, who arrived on the “Sir George Seymour” in November 1850. He was also the first master of the school.
