## Letter from Fr Robert Jamieson

Dear friends,

As I write this letter, a small team has gathered at St Michael and All Angels to ring our church bell, marking our 175th anniversary. As the bells ring out across the city at 12 noon, it is a beautiful reminder of God's presence with us in everyday life.

On this third Sunday of Epiphany, we continue to rejoice in the light that has dawned upon the world through Jesus Christ. Epiphany is a season of divine unveiling, when God's glory is revealed not in distant splendour but in the ordinary places of human life.

Isaiah proclaims that those who walked in darkness have seen a great light, and the Church affirms that this promise is fulfilled in Christ. The Gospel places this light in Galilee, a region on the margins, where Jesus begins his ministry of preaching, healing, and calling. He walks by the sea, speaks a simple word, and lives are transformed. Follow me, he says, and fishermen become disciples — not by leaving the world behind but by seeing it anew.

Epiphany reminds us that Christ still enters our daily routines and calls us to participate in his work of mending what is broken and proclaiming the nearness of God's kingdom.

Saint Paul, writing to the Corinthians, guides us inward. The light of Christ reveals not only the darkness of the world but also our own divisions. He calls the Church to be united in mind and purpose, centred on the Cross of Christ; what the world may regard as foolishness is, for us, the very wisdom and power of God, a love strong enough to reconcile and renew.

As we gather today, may we receive the light of Christ once more and carry it with joy into our homes, our parish, and our neighbourhood. In word and sacrament, in service and in peace, may our life together reflect the Epiphany truth that God's light shines, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you but that you be knit together in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been made clear to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptised in the name of Paul?

I thank God that I baptised none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptised in my name. I did baptise also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptised anyone else. For Christ did not send me to baptise but to proclaim the gospel—and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: “Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the gentiles—the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned.”

From that time Jesus began to proclaim, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.”

As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishers. And he said to them, “Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people.” Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him. Jesus went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ the Word.**
