Benediction

As the hymn ends, the wakahuia is lowered. All kneel and remain kneeling throughout. The Sacrament is placed on the altar and the bell is rung.

O Saving Victim, opening wide the gate of heaven to us below, our foes press hard on every side, thine aid supply, thy strength bestow.
All praise and thanks to thee ascend for evermore, blest one in three; O grant us life that shall not end, in our true native land with thee. Amen.

The celebrant leads the people in prayer, ending with the Grace.

Benediction: Therefore we before him bending Richard de Pearsal

Therefore we, before him bending, this great Sacrament revere; Types and shadows have their ending, for the newer rite is here; Faith, our outward sense befriending. Makes the inward vision clear.

Glory let us give, and blessing, to the Father and the Son: Honour, might, and praise addressing, while eternal ages run; Ever too his love confessing, who, from both, with both is one.

Thou gavest them bread from heaven: Containing in itself all sweetness.

The bell is rung again as the celebrant gives the blessing with the Sacrament.
