From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

Firstly, I want to thank everyone for their support of Father Simon's recent ordination. It was a wonderful service of celebration not just for him but also for us as a Parish. As I said on Sunday, please continue to hold Father Simon in your prayers as he begins his ministry as Priest amongst us. We are not certain on his role here at St Michael's going into the future but we hope to have some clarity on that in the coming weeks. This Sunday we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity with Trinity Sunday. It is the first Sunday

after Pentecost. In the early Church no special Office or day was in fact assigned for the Holy Trinity. When the Arian heresy was spreading the Fathers prepared an Office with canticles, responses, a Preface, and hymns, to be recited on Sundays. In the Sacramentary of St. Gregory the Great (590-604) there are prayers and the Preface of the Trinity.

In the 11th century Pope Alexander II (1061-1073), refused a petition for a special feast on the plea, that such a feast was not customary in the Roman Church which he argued already daily honored the Holy Trinity by the Gloria, Glory be, etc., but he did not forbid the celebration where it already existed. Pope John XXII (1316-1334) ordered and established the feast for the entire Church on the first Sunday after Pentecost. A new Office had been made by the Franciscan John Peckham, Canon of Lyons, later Archbishop of Canterbury (d. 1292). The feast ranked as a double of the second class but was raised to the dignity of a primary of the first class, 24 July 1911, by Pius X. The Greek Orthodox have no special feast. Since it was after the first great Pentecost that the doctrine of the Trinity was proclaimed to the world, the feast becomingly follows that of Pentecost. Join us as we celebrate this Great Feast of the Church as we move back into Ordinary Time.

I will be away for two Sundays (26 May & 2 June) during which Father Simon will be celebrating and Father Peter Williams and Margaret Maclagan preaching. We will also have the Feast of Corpus Christi during that period on Thursday 30 May at 7pm. Last Sunday we omitted the readings from the service sheet. This is a 'trial'. There has been some feedback about those who need the readings due to hearing difficulties or language. Just a reminder therefore that there are limited copies of the readings available at the door, please just ask the Sidesperson. I look forward to seeing you all on my return from leave.
