From the Vicar...

The mystery of the most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine of Faith in Christianity, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature. Our mind cannot grasp this doctrine which teaches that 1+1+1 = 1 and not 3. But we believe in this Mystery because Jesus who is God taught it clearly, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian Faith.

However, one must not think that this was an easy, over-the-night task. Coming to terms with God's self-revelation as Holy Trinity occupied a huge amount of the Church's collective thinking for the first few centuries. Professor of preaching at *Emory University in Atlanta* Thomas G Long put's it well 'Christian theologians do not sit around for fun in ivy-covered buildings weaving doctrines out of wisps, shadows, and thin air. Christian doctrines tend to originate like river bridges built by armies; that is, assembled on the fly in seasons of need and are crafted in the field to bear the weight of people marching on a mission.'

In other words, our experiences of God as Holy Trinity are not just philosophical but a living reality, found in the worship of the gathered community. And so, it is important as we gather on this Feast of the Holy Trinity that we recognise the mystery at the heart of our faith and take the opportunity to lean even more into that mystery. For it is here that God as three-in-one is fully recognised, in the love and community of God's people who gather every Sunday to live out this truth. That God by his very nature draws us into the divine community of love, so that we may have the hope of becoming one with God, Holy and Blessed Trinity.
