From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

It's been a while since I spoke of the weather so I thought I would start this week's letter by stating how spring has been off to a rocky start! Nonetheless, things are looking brighter and it is only one week away until we change our clocks forward for the start of daylight savings. Just a friendly reminder to do that so you don't miss out on our Michaelmas celebrations on the 29th. For the Feast of St Michael and All Angels we are offering a Choral Matins in the morning which is not often done. If you are unsure as to what Choral Matins is, it is Morning Prayer from the Book of Common Prayer following the usual Evensong pattern with different canticles and prayers. And in the evening of course we have our Solemn Mass at 5pm. This will be a special service with Bishop Peter in attendance with five confirmations. Our candidates for confirmation are Alana Pidgeon, Robbie Moore, Richard Thompson, Vijay & Shirley Edward Raj. Please hold them in your prayers this week as they prepare for this important step in their Christian life.

As you may be aware these past few weeks I have been discussing Catholic Anglican approaches to church and worship. This week I wish to speak about the Priesthood. From an Anglo-Catholic perspective the Mass is the Sacrifice of the new Covenant. Therefore, the Christian ministry requires a priesthood. The whole baptised community is of course 'a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people' (1 Peter 2.9). But the communion sacrifice has always been understood as requiring a priestly ministry to make the offering on behalf of the people of God. This priestly function reflects the priestly offering of Christ himself who 'ever lives to intercede for us with the Father' (Hebrews 7.25).

The word presbyter, 'elder', occurs often in the New Testament. But from the earliest Christian era, well before the scriptures were in their final form, the terminology of the sacrificing priesthood (Greek *hiereus*, Latin *Sacerdos*) was applied to this ministerial order which shares with the ministry of the Bishop all sacramental charisms except the gift of conferring the priesthood on others.

The ministry of priests is that of blessing and mediating the offering of the whole people of God; this presiding or celebrating ministry includes teaching and preaching. The priest is the Bishop's 'deputy' in the parish community and, united with a college of fellow priests around the Bishop, represents the local Christian community in a diocese.

First Reading: (sit) Wisdom of Solomon 1:6-2:1, 12-22 Therese Aitchison For wisdom is a kindly spirit, but will not free blasphemers from the guilt of their words; because God is witness of their inmost feelings, and a true observer of their hearts, and a hearer of their tongues. Because the spirit of the Lord has filled the world, and that which holds all things together knows what is said, therefore those who utter unrighteous things will not escape notice, and justice, when it punishes, will not pass them by.

For inquiry will be made into the counsels of the ungodly, and a report of their words will come to the Lord, to convict them of their lawless deeds; because a jealous ear hears all things, and the sound of grumbling does not go unheard. Beware then of useless grumbling, and keep your tongue from slander; because no secret word is without result, and a lying mouth destroys the soul.

Do not invite death by the error of your life, or bring on destruction by the works of your hands; because God did not make death, and he does not delight in the death of the living. For he created all things so that they might exist; the generative forces of the world are wholesome, and there is no destructive poison in them, and the dominion of Hades is not on earth. For righteousness is immortal.

But the ungodly by their words and deeds summoned death; considering him a friend, they pined away and made a covenant with him, because they are fit to belong to his company. For they reasoned unsoundly, saying to themselves, 'Short and sorrowful is our life, and there is no remedy when a life comes to its end, and no one has been known to return from Hades. 'Let us lie in wait for the righteous man, because he is inconvenient to us and opposes our actions; he reproaches us for sins against the law, and accuses us of sins against our training. He professes to have knowledge of God, and calls himself a child of the Lord. He became to us a reproof of our thoughts; the very sight of him is a burden to us, because his manner of life is unlike that of others, and his ways are strange. We are considered by him as something base, and he avoids our ways as unclean; he calls the last end of the righteous happy, and boasts that God is his father. Let us see if his words are true, and let us test what will happen at the end of his life; for if the righteous man is God's child, he will help him, and will deliver him from the hand of his adversaries. Let us test him with insult and torture, so that we may find out how gentle he is, and make trial of his forbearance. Let us condemn him to a shameful death, for, according to what he says, he will be protected.'

Thus they reasoned, but they were led astray, for their wickedness blinded them, and they did not know the secret purposes of God, nor hoped for the wages of holiness, nor discerned the prize for blameless souls;

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace. Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you.
